#### Agenda

### **Affordable Housing Context Conversation**

William McFarland created an opportunity to have a dialogue about past and present housing advocacy efforts in the City, generally and specific to the Beltline. The objective of this conversation was to provide context for ultimately determining BAHAB's role and positioning relative to current and future policy issues and advocacy efforts.
